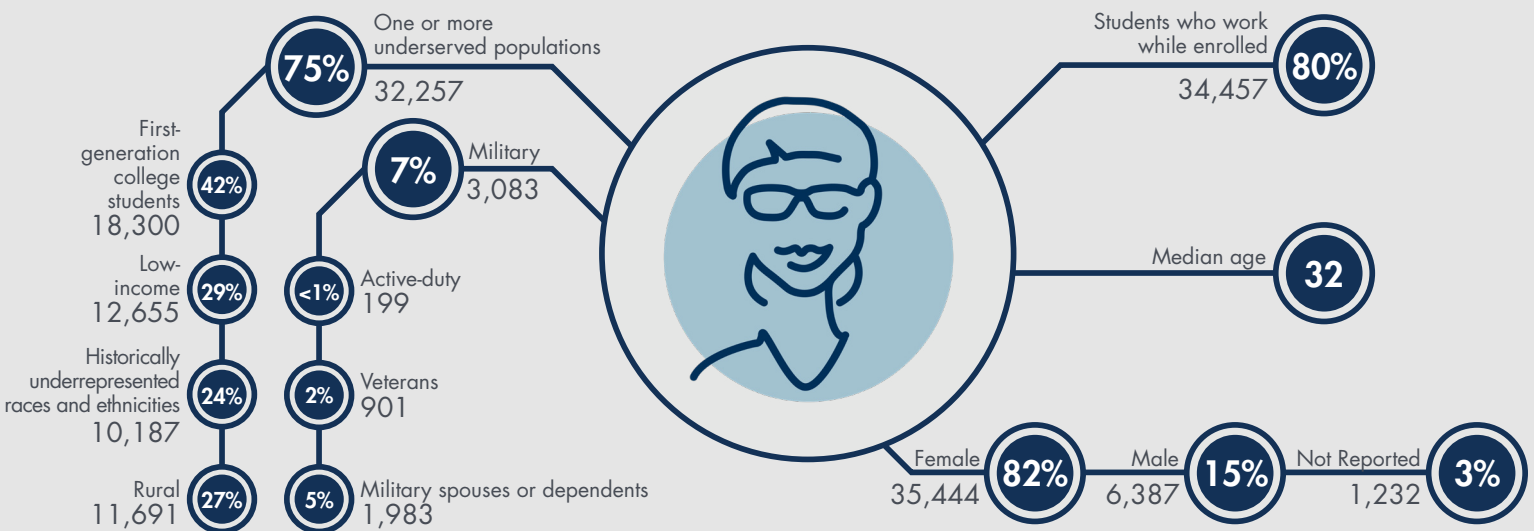

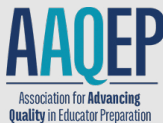
Degrees that Include Licensure
